# Co-ops give back

Thanksgiving is a time of giving and a time to express gratitude for the past year. JCE Co-op is grateful to you, our member consumers. Every day we work tirelessly to provide you with safe, reliable and affordable services that provide value to you.

As a not-for-profit rural co-op, we do not make a profit. Any funds left over each year are called margins and are assigned to members in the form of capital credits. The assignment is based proportionately on how much electricity, gas or internet service that you purchased in a given year.

Capital credit assignments are held in an account in your name until voted to be returned by the cooperative's board of directors. It represents your equity in the cooperative because you are a member-owner. Capital credits are a benefit of cooperative membership. In December each year, you may receive either a credit on your bill or a check in the mail.

In addition to the capital credit that you may receive, this year we have given back to our electric member consumers an additional credit through our power cost adjustment (PCA). The reason for this credit is that wholesale power prices were less than what was originally budgeted in November 2022. Because we are a not-for-profit co-op, we have been crediting those savings back to you for the past several months. As of the beginning of October, we have credited our electric member consumers with more than \$1.5 million dollars.

Giving back is a major part of our mission to serve our members and communities. Concern for Community, the seventh cooperative principle, is the heart and soul of who we are as a co-op.

That's why we support local organizations with donations through programs like Sharing Success Grants and other sponsorships. # **Resume of Minutes**

Aug. 30, 2023

The regular board meeting of Jo-Carroll Energy, Inc. (NFP) was held on Wednesday, Aug. 30, 2023.

Safety Moment — Director Al Hendren discussed safe use of electrical cords and the dangers associated with misuse of electrical cords.

Approval of Agenda — A motion was made, seconded, and carried unanimously to approve the meeting agenda.

Consent Agenda — A motion was made, seconded, and carried unanimously to approve the consent agenda.

Presentation — A Brand Identity Proposal was presented by Paula Keck, Graphic Design and Marketing Coordinator, and Derek Bradt, Broadband Marketing & Sales Administrator. In addition, a Broadband Market Analysis was presented.

## **Governance Topics and Board Policy Review**

# **CEO/Financial Operating Report**

**CEO Report** — President and CEO Mike Casper discussed the ongoing rate analysis that will be presented to the board in November.

Financial Operating Report — Chuck Woods, Chief Financial Officer, provided a summary of the July financial operating report. Revenue year-to-date (YTD) is approximately \$38.8 million. Total operations and maintenance expenses are approximately \$30 million, which is \$3,493,470 under budget of \$34 million. Margins are approximately \$2.9 million versus a budgeted amount of (\$241,365) and amounts to \$3.2 million

over budget. By general consent, the board moved to file the financial operating report with the auditor.

## **Operations and Regulatory/Legislative Update**

Operations Update — Senior V.P. and Chief Operating Officer Kyle Buros provided an update on the Natural Gas (NG) Burns Road project and other NG projects.

Member Services Update — V.P. of Member Services Jennifer Meyer discussed the latest trends in member services, such as e-bills and alerts. JCE continues to promote these services to our members.

Human Resources Update — Merri Sevey, V.P. of Human Resources, provided an update on new hires at the cooperative (new and replacements), noting that a new organizational chart will be updated soon.

Executive Assistant Update — Amy Johnston, Executive Assistant, had nothing to add outside of her written staff report.

### External Affairs/Legislative Update —

General Counsel Terry Kurt provided an update on a nuclear energy moratorium that Governor Pritzker implemented. In addition, Kurt noted that he will be receiving National Rural Electric Cooperative Association (NRECA) legal briefs.

Discuss Candidates for CFC District 5 Board of Directors — Candidates for the CFC District 5 Board of Directors were discussed.

EV Chargers Position Statement — The Position Statement for EV Chargers was presented to the board as part of a review process prior to the 2024 strategic planning session.



# **Electric budget billing accounts to recalculate**

o-Carroll Energy members with budget bill-Jing electric accounts will have their budget amounts recalculated in November.

Because a budget bill amount is based on an average of the previous 12 months' use and outstanding credits or accrued debits, this November true-up recalculation may result in an increase or decrease, depending on changes in your use patterns.

Be sure to look at your November statement to see if your budget amount has changed. If a change results from the recalculation, a message will appear on your statement in blue indicating the new budget amount.

If you do not see a message on your statement, your budget billing amount remained the same.

If you have more than one billing account on budget, it is possible that one or both amounts may change. You begin paying the new budget amount in December.

Invoice billed members should remember that no messages will be printed on your bill statement whether the budget bill amount thandes L. and Vivian K. Eaton It you would like to know your new budget bill amount, please call our offices between the hours of 7:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. Monday-Friday or email us at info@jocarroll.com.

Budget billing can help you manage your energy costs by allowing you to allocate the same amount each month. Monthly utility bills can vary significantly throughout the year due to variations in your usage through heating and cooling seasons.

With JCE's budget billing plan you eliminate the month-to-month fluctuations caused by changing weather and use patterns. It is imperative that members on budget billing still watch their monthly use and outstanding balances to ensure a large increase does not occur during a recalculation month.

# Levelized billing also available

JCE also offers a levelized billing program. Under this plan, each monthly bill is the rolling average of your electric use for the most recent 12 months, thus eliminating true-up months.

This means you will not pay the exact same amount every month, but it will be close to the same. The amount you owe some months will be more than the average; other months it will be less.

Over the year, you will have paid what you owe. Levelized billing does not reduce your bill; it helps you manage your utility payments.

# **Neighbor to Neighbor Care Fund offers help**

If you need assistance paying your energy bill this winter, help may be available through Jo-Carroll Energy's Neighbor to Neighbor Care Fund.

# Jo-Carroll Energy, statewide scholarship applications open

Jo-Carroll Energy will award up to \$25,000 to students from its service territory through its scholarship program. In addition, Illinois electric cooperatives in 2024 will award 14 academic scholarships to high school seniors from across Illinois through a memorial scholarship fund.

# The Jo-Carroll Energy Scholarship Program

The JCE Scholarship Program includes four different scholarships for graduating high school seniors:

- Six Jo-Carroll Energy Scholarships in the amount of \$1,000
- Four \$1,000 scholarships for students who will attend two-year technical or trade schools
- Two lineworker scholarships in the amount of \$2,000 each
- 10 Director's Scholarships of \$500 each.

In addition, JCE offers four \$1,500 scholar-ships for adult students who have not previously pursued post-high school education. These scholarships are available to current JCE members in good standing and have graduated high school before 2021. Applicants must be enrolled or accepted to an accredited post-secondary school or program that would lead to their first degree, certification or licensure.



The deadline to apply for all scholarships, except the Director's Scholarships, is March 1, 2024. The deadline for Director's Scholarships is May 1, 2024.

## **IEC Memorial Scholarships**

Illinois electric cooperatives will award 17 scholarships in 2024 to financially assist deserving students in the electric cooperative family. These scholarships, \$2,000 each, are awarded through the Thomas H. Moore Illinois Electric Cooperatives (IEC) Memorial Scholarship Program.

- Ten scholarships will be awarded to high school seniors whose parent(s) are an Illinois electric co-op member.
- One scholarship, the Earl W. Struck Memorial Scholarship, will be awarded to a student who is the child of an Illinois electric cooperative employee or director.
- Five additional scholarships are reserved for high school seniors enrolling full time at a two-year Illinois community college whose parent(s) are an Illinois cooperative member, employee or director.
- The LaVern and Nola McEntire Lineworker's Scholarship will help pay for costs to attend lineworker school conducted by the Association of Illinois Electric Cooperatives in conjunction with Lincoln Land Community College, Springfield.
